The author states in his paper that an important source of difficulties for pupils is that in many cases we use some mathematical concepts inaccurately, moreover we use inaccurate concepts from time to time. The examples of the second group are concepts defined differently by different teachers or textbooks. In the third group the author gives a list of mistakes coming from inaccurate notations.
